
JUDICIAL EMERGENCY ORDER

Pursuant to O.C.G.A. §38-3-60 et. seq., and U.S.C.R. 45, the Stone Mountain Judicial Circuit's Superior Court Chief and Administrative Court Judge Courtney L. Johnson finds that the inclement weather created a hazardous situation including snow and dangerous road conditions that substantially endangered or infringed upon the normal functioning of the DeKalb County judicial system, the ability of persons to avail themselves of the DeKalb County judicial system, and the ability of litigants or others to have access to the DeKalb County Courthouse to meet schedules or time deadlines imposed by court order or rule, statute, or administrative rule or regulation. IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 38-3-62, all court deadlines, time schedules or filing requirements are hereby suspended, tolled, or extended for the duration of the judicial emergency as noted below.

The DeKalb County Courthouse, located at 556 North McDonough Street, Decatur, Georgia 30030, was closed Friday December 8, 2017 beginning at 2:00pm. The following courts are affected by this order: DeKalb County Superior Court, DeKalb County State Court, DeKalb County Magistrate Court, DeKalb County Juvenile Court and DeKalb County Probate Court.

The DeKalb County Courthouse and the above-listed courts reopened for regular business on Monday December 11, 2017.
